b. \$6.45 million has been raised so far. \$9.5 million has been spent so far, with about \$1.5 million that will probably still need to be paid. That will leave about \$4.5 million to Finish the Work.

"Finish the Work" Building Committee Report - Mr. Don Fruit

- a. Construction is progressing well. The south entrance will be open for buses at the beginning of the school year. 2nd-floor classrooms will be ready for the start of the school year.
- b. The temporary wall will remain up in the commons until the work on the new entrance is complete.
- c. Volunteer painters will be needed again in the middle of September.
- d. The vacant lot has been purchased and is now owned by the association.

Director of Mission Advancement Report - Mr. John Byus

- A. Publications is changing and will produce the Advocate magazine three times a year.
- B. The Mission Advancement Committee reviewed the director's position and made two motions. The first was to commend John for a great job in his first year as Director of Mission Advancement.
