Sermon: Ezekiel 2:1-5

¹ He said to me, "Son of man, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you." ² The Spirit entered into me as he spoke to me and brought me up to my feet. Then I heard him speaking to me. ³ He said to me, "Son of man, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to disloyal nations, who have been disloyal to me. They and their fathers have rebelled against me to this very day. ⁴ These children of mine are brazen-faced and hard-hearted. I am sending you to them, and you are to tell them that this is what the LORD God says. ⁵ Then, whether they listen or do not listen—for they are a rebellious house—then they will know that a prophet has been among them.
